

Postoperative Care Instructions Following Laryngoscopy/Bronchoscopy/Esophagoscopy

Medications

- Take Tylenol and/or Motrin for pain as needed.
- A cool mist vaporizer will help alleviate dry throat.
- Resume all other medications unless otherwise noted.

Activity

- For 24 hours: Limit your activity for the next 24 hours and get plenty of rest.
- You may plan to return to work as tolerated.
- Excessive voice use should be minimized for 1 week after surgery. Do not scream or whisper, just speak normally when speaking unless on voice rest.

Diet

- No restrictions.
- Ensure adequate hydration following surgery.

Call your doctor (or go to the emergency room) if you have

- Unusual pain in the throat
- Fever over 101.5 F that doesn't improve with Tylenol
- Any active bleeding. You may spit up some blood-tinged mucus which is normal
- Any trouble breathing or shortness of breath
- Surgical area becomes red, swollen, warm to touch, or drains pus
- · Patient becomes listless, hard to arouse
- Urine changes color, especially if it becomes cola-colored
